#### Mixer/Batch Plant Upgrade

The company has initiated a major upgrade program of its batch plants and concrete mixer systems. While initially focusing on our main grey concrete plant, the upgrade will eventually expand and encompass our Architectural plant and Softsound plant.

A list of over 50 project items, big and small, has been identified and is being worked on by a team including **J.R. Holmes, Guy Schuch, Rodney Smith** and **Roderick Smith**, with the assistance of various outside contractors. Among these are:

- New batch plant office building to house centralized controls for all batching facilities.
- New computer controlled batching system to allow fully automated, accurate and reliable batching.
- Significant maintenance work to make all systems functional and reliable.
- Improvements to all material handling systems and their controls.
- General housekeeping and dust control improvements for cleaning the mixer.

The purpose of this project is to improve the general condition of the batch plant systems for accurate, efficient and reliable operation while providing our associates with an enjoyable work environment.





### **Easi-Set Buildings to Provide Realistic Setting to Train Troops**

**Smith-Midland** is providing additional buildings to a military facility in **Virginia Beach, Virginia**. The new order, consisting of larger buildings, will represent a more realistic setting for training troops.

Officials at the secured military facility were very pleased with the original thirty 10' x 12' Easi-Set buildings delivered in 2008. **Mark Kuhn**, buildings supervisor, met with the client, who was very excited to find out that we make larger buildings. After online bidding, it was awarded to SMC – this success was due to **Mark** and the SMC team for providing the best price and service possible. Kudos!

The order includes one 20' x 20' and two 20' x 40' Easi-Span™ buildings, and two 10' x 12' Easi-Set buildings, all 10' tall. These additional buildings will be configured to represent larger structures that troops might face during combat. Two Easi-Span™ buildings will be installed adjacent to each other to represent a larger building. The other building will be placed in an "L" pattern. These structures will add to the existing training "Village" of the thirty buildings that are in place currently

#### Virginia Tech Basketball Facility

Smith-Midland is providing the architectural precast concrete panels for the exterior of the Virginia Tech Basketball Practice Facility in Blacksburg, Virginia. The \$20 million, 59,000 square foot practice facility will



house the men's and women's basketball programs and will include two weight rooms, one for the basketball programs and the other for Olympic sports teams.

The contract for the concrete panels awarded to SMC is valued at \$1.3 million and features 30,125 square feet of architectural precast panels. The panels are 6" thick, steel reinforced, with a buff limestone finish. Basketball imprints will be cast into the panels along with the Virginia Tech Logo.
